





Grow an Avocado Plant DIY



Duration: 15-30 min



🌇 Difficulty: **Medium**



Cost: \$0 to \$5

Observe part of the avocado plant's life cycle!

Material List

- Ripe avocado
- **Cutting board**
- Knife adult use only!
- Bowl of water
- Clear plastic cup of water
- **Toothpicks**

Instructions

- Ask an adult to cut open the avocado and remove the seed.
- Wash the seed in the bowl of water.
- Peel away and discard the thin brown skin around the seed.
- Hold the seed so that the pointier end is up.
- Push 3 evenly spaced toothpicks into the seed (not on the fault
- 6 Carefully place the seed into the cup by resting the toothpicks on the lip.
- Pour water into the cup until the seed is halfway covered.
- Place the cup with the seed in a warm place in direct sunlight.
- Wait for the avocado seed to sprout, which will take 4-8 weeks.
- Change the water once per week.

How It Works

An avocado starts its life cycle as a seed. When planted, the seed germinates (starts to grow) in about 4-8 weeks. The seed splits along the fault line, allowing a root to grow down and a sprout to grow up. As the sprout grows leaves, it becomes a seedling, and then continues to grow into an avocado plant. Eventually, the avocado plant produces flowers, and finally fruit after 4-5 years. Inside each avocado fruit is another seed—ready to start its own life cycle.
